Question 6 (two options) Option A is based on Question 5 of AQA GCSE English Language Paper 2. Option B is the picture option of Q5 AQA GCSE Paper 1.

Requires evidence in the form of short quotations, explanation of what the evidence tells us and inference over why similarities or differences exist

Assessed using **AO2**: **Analyse** how the writers' use language and structure, **relevant terminology** needed.

**Quotes** picked from the text followed by **explanation** of the **effect** of the phrase using **directly related language**. Zoom in on **individual words**.



A **focus** on the **writers' techniques**. **How** they get their message across.

Assessed using **AO2**: **Analyse** how the writers' use language and structure, **relevant terminology** needed.

Question will include **bullet points**, giving **additional information** on what you have to **focus** on.

You will be given a **quote** analysing the reading(s) that you will need to **agree** or **disagree** with. Still a reading question so your answer must be **based** in the **text**. You should include **analysis** of both **what the writer says** and **how they say it**.

Assessed using **AO4** (A critical analysis of the text)

You will be given **bullet points** to guide you.
