


GCSE English Equivalency Instructions


Setting up your exam

1. On the day of your exam: 5-25 minutes before your exam is about to start, you will be sent a zoom link to your email address.
2. On the zoom call, you will be sent a link to the exam system by your invigilator.
3. You will also be sent a unique exam key. Enter this key into the field shown:



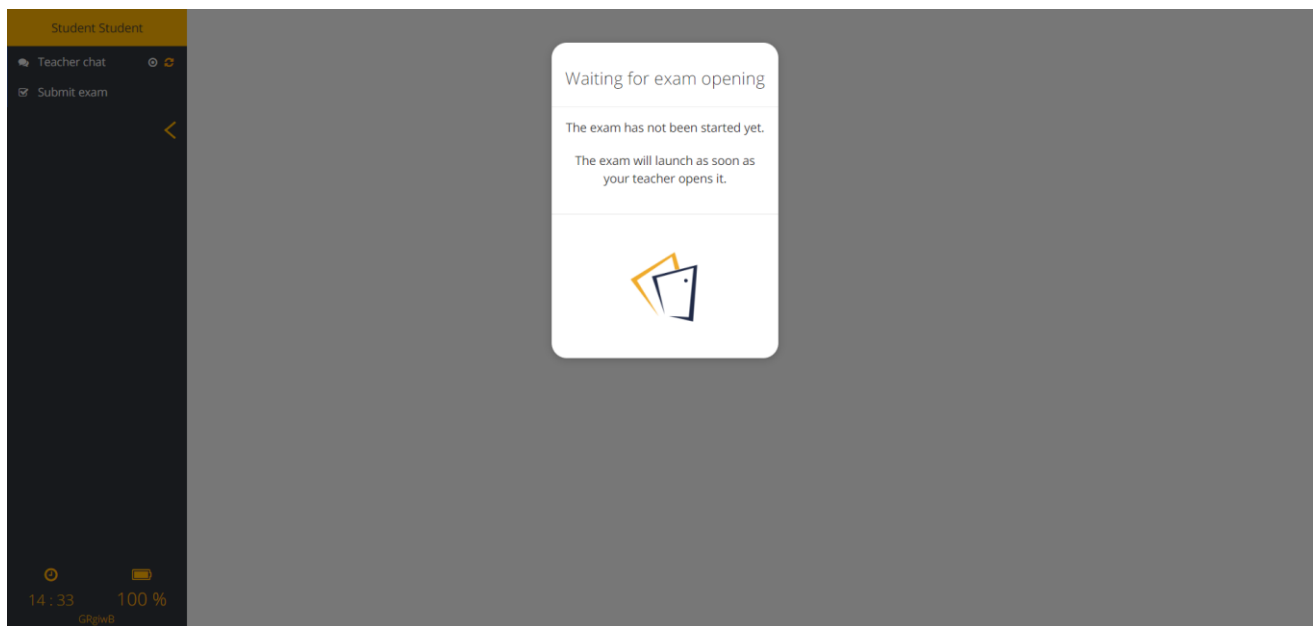

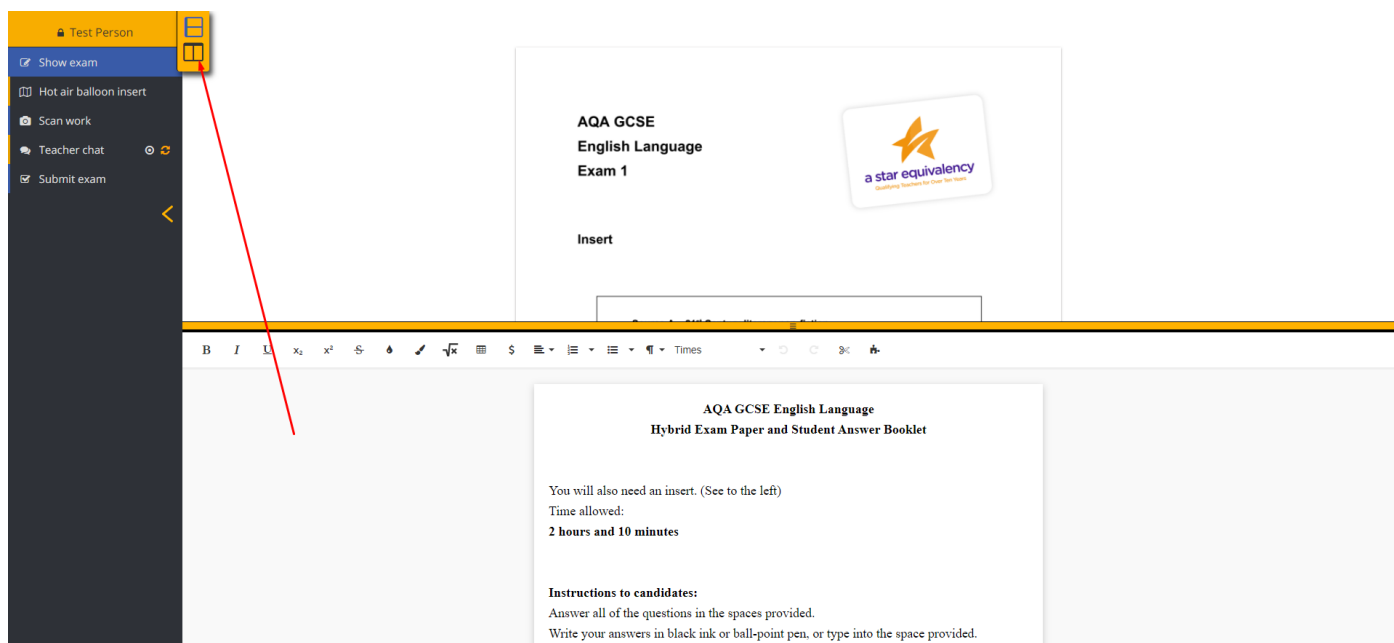
5. You will then be placed in a waiting room until the invigilator opens the exam



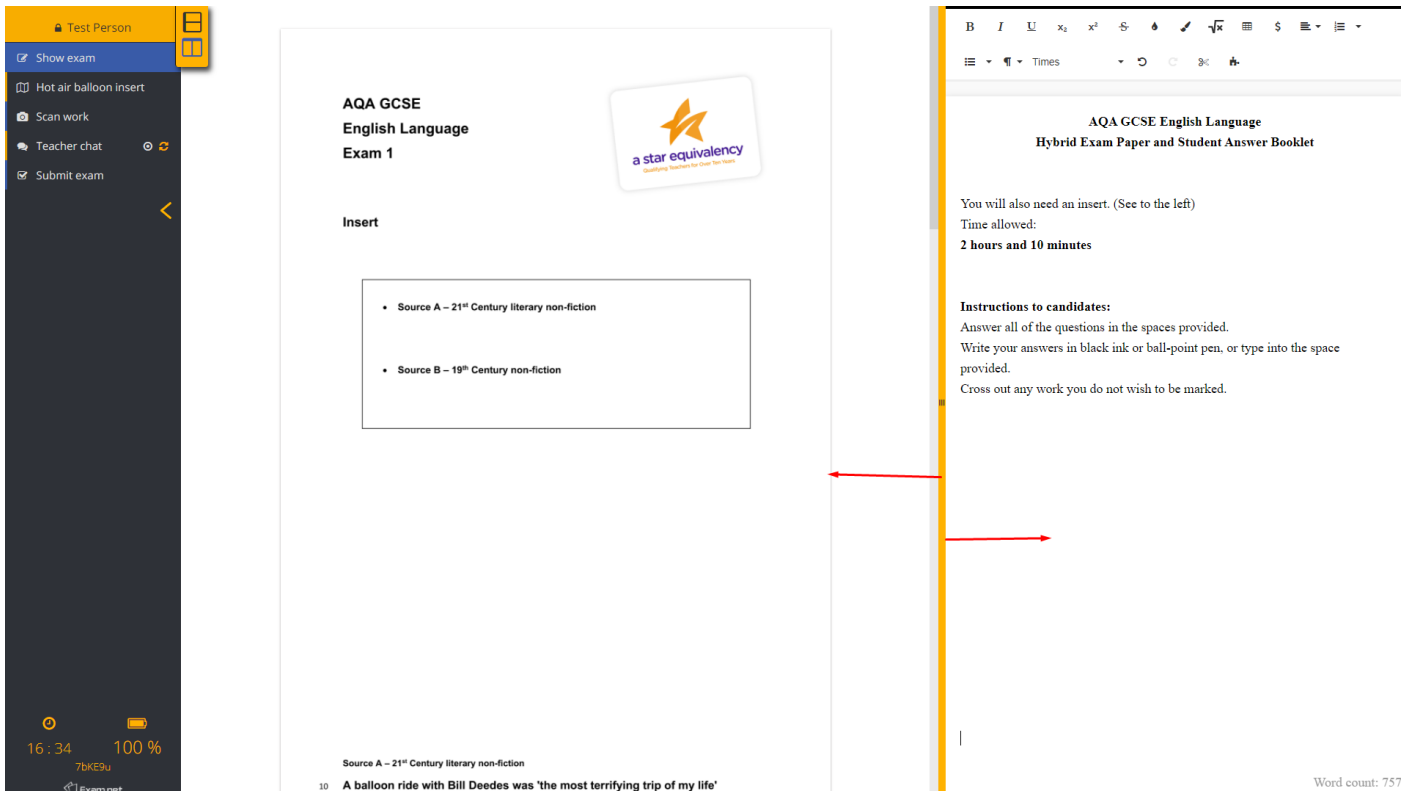
Once the exam starts you will need to change the view.



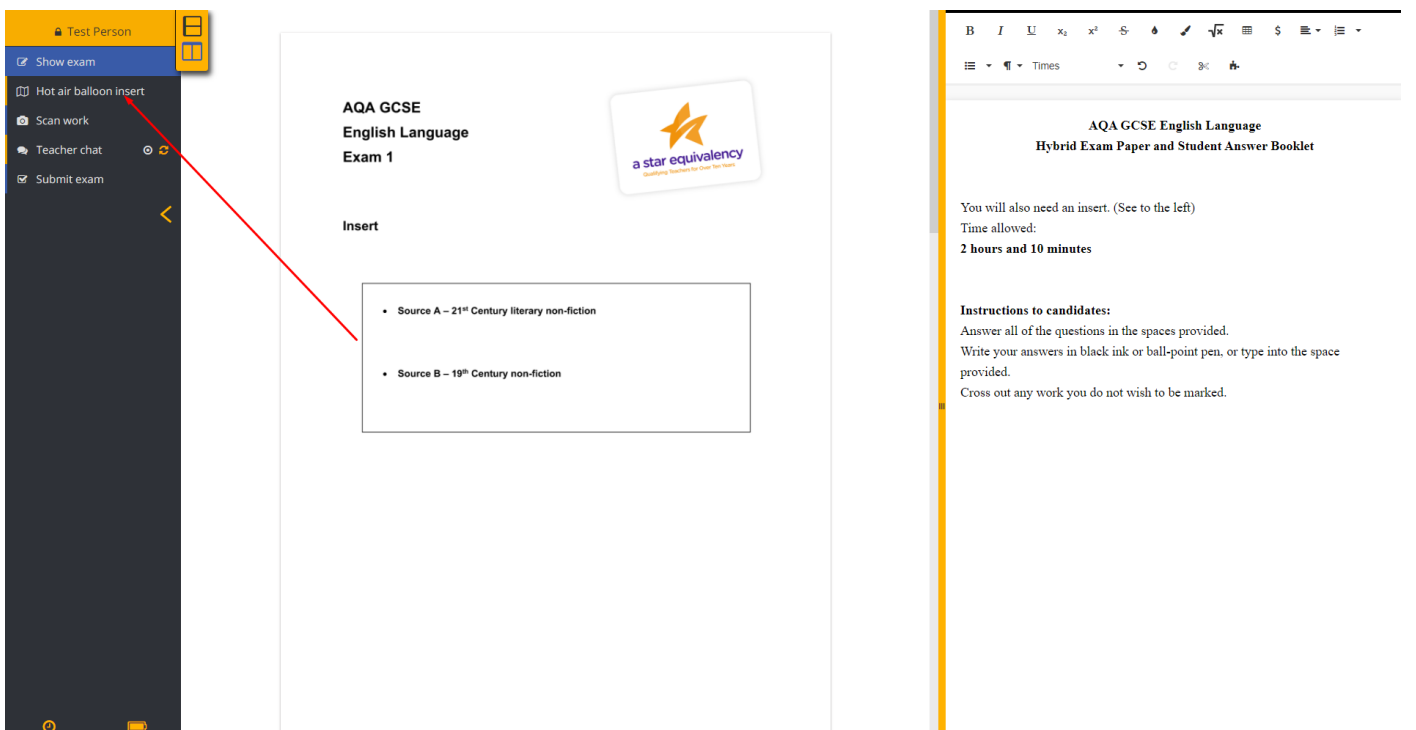
6. First, select the icon in the top left which looks like this

1. Using the insert on the left, read the questions on the right.
